"Everyone is welcome. If people are hungry we feed them and give them a bag of groceries," Howard said. "If they need a place to cool off in the summer or stay to keep warm in the winter they're welcome. If they need to talk or ask for prayer, there is always someone available to talk and pray with them."

The program was birthed in September 2008 when a 10-person Bible study group saw a need within the communities of Erlanger and Elsmere to minister to families who were struggling to make ends meet.



According to Howard, the first meal drew 25 enthusiastic volunteers to cook and serve only two people.

"Rather than be discouraged the Manna Mission kept moving forward to the point where we are now serving our 100th meal on Dec. 17 with an average attendance of 125 people each month."

In 2010 the program added a Grocery Give Away, where they give groceries to guests after the meal.

Howard said being involved with Manna Mission has been a reality check for him.

"I see all the good I have in my life, a job, a roof over my head, a loving family and friends," he said. "Then I witness those who attend Manna Mission who struggle on

a daily basis to make ends meet. They always say, 'thank you.' I know I'm there to serve them, but in actuality many a time they're serving me with their gratitude."

For grocery coordinator Bill Slaven it's all about showing love.

"Manna Mission is about showing people in need, and those who are not, that God is in the world," he said. "Whether that need is a hot meal, a few groceries, a kind word, or a simple hello. God has a task for all of us to do, by taking care of each other despite our differences.

"Serving in Manna Mission each month's a way of showing the needy that they are still loved and important to God and in doing that He has provided me with new friends. In serving God, who am I but a servant."

Tim Healy, a founder of Manna Mission, enjoys seeing the positive impact on the community.

"Every month I see people come through our doors who are not that different from me," he said. "That reminds me that I need to reach out to them, and to try to meet their needs. If we can bring a modicum of relief and a few moments of happiness to their lives, that's a positive thing. That's what I believe we've been called to do. It's so often hard to tell when you're making a difference. I never wonder about that with Manna Mission."

Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me."
