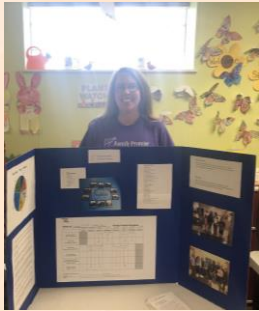
NATIONAL CHILDCARE WORKER APPRECIATION

OUR GRADUATE - GRACE HERRMANN

Grace Herrmann, daughter of Tim and Carrie Herrmann, was born January 26, 2001 in Edgewood, Kentucky. She is a 2019 *summa cum laude* graduate of Lloyd Memorial High School, Erlanger, Kentucky. Grace grew up in the Erlanger community, attending Miles Elementary School and Tichenor Middle School. During her twelve years of education, Grace had perfect attendance ten years and was on the Honor Roll every grading period for twelve years.

Leadership Development has been an important part of Grace's educational experience. She has participated in Regional Youth Leadership, National Honor Society, Youth for Understanding, the Duke Talent Identification Program, Thomas More's STEM Institute, Women LEAD Conference, West Point Leadership & Ethics Seminar, Freshman Student Government, the National Energy Education Development (years 35, 36, 37, and 38) Annual Youth Awards for Energy Achievement. This led to Grace's recognition for the National Energy Education Development Project of the Year and Project of the Year Runner Up. She also wrote, implemented, and administered the Disney Friends for Change Grant and presented the Veterans' Day Speech in 2017 and 2018.

Grace was a member of the Academic Team for seven years, participated in the Governor's Cup Competition and Quiz Bowl. She was a member of the Spanish Club, Energy Club, Read It First, and Juggernauts Editor for one year.

Grace's academic excellence is evident in her mastery of eight dual-credit courses, her being awarded a Japan-U.S. Senate Exchange Scholarship, KEES Money, the Woodmen-Life American History Award and named a National Merit Scholar Finalist. She has received the Highest GPA Award in these courses: AP Environmental Science, NKU Calculus, Algebra 2, AP World History, Biology, Chemistry, English 2, Geometry, as well as Health and Physical Education.

Grace has also found time for volunteering here at EUMC including helping with Vacation Bible School, the Fall Festival, the Sound Booth, singing Christmas Carols to Shut-Ins, and Manna Mission. She has contributed to the efforts of Reforest Northern Kentucky, Adopt-A-Block, the Boys/Girls Club and Build a Dream. Peer tutoring and babysitting complete Grace's activities.

Grace has been accepted and is enrolled in Western Kentucky University, Bowling Green, Kentucky. She plans to pursue a degree in Environmental Science with the goal of doing either research or outreach.



Sunday, May 19, 2019, it was a great day of worship. Linda Martin and Pastors Andrew and Bill sang a song we often sing during our chapel time with Grace Edgett day care. 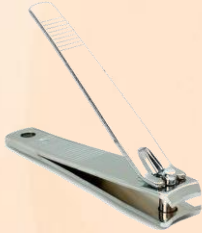


GLORY TO GOD

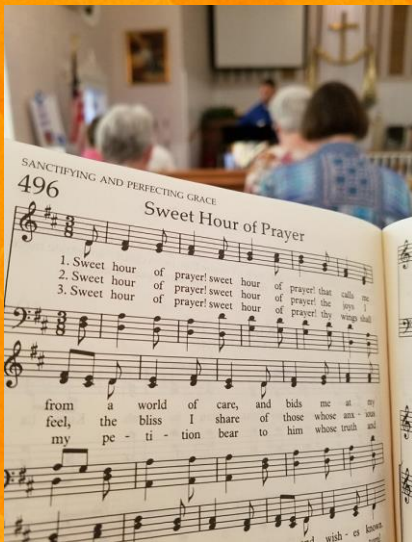
